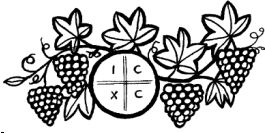

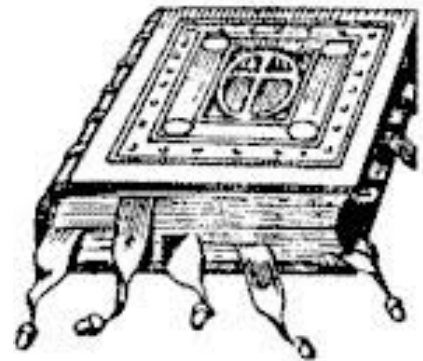
FIRST READING: A reading from the book of Leviticus 19:1-2,17-18

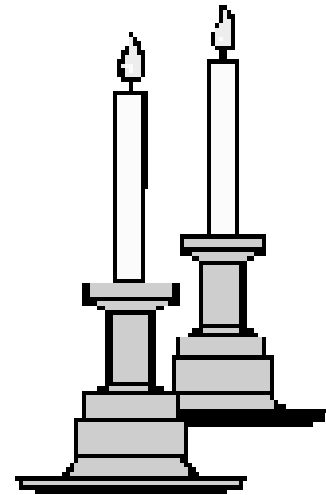


2. It is he who forgives all your guilt,
