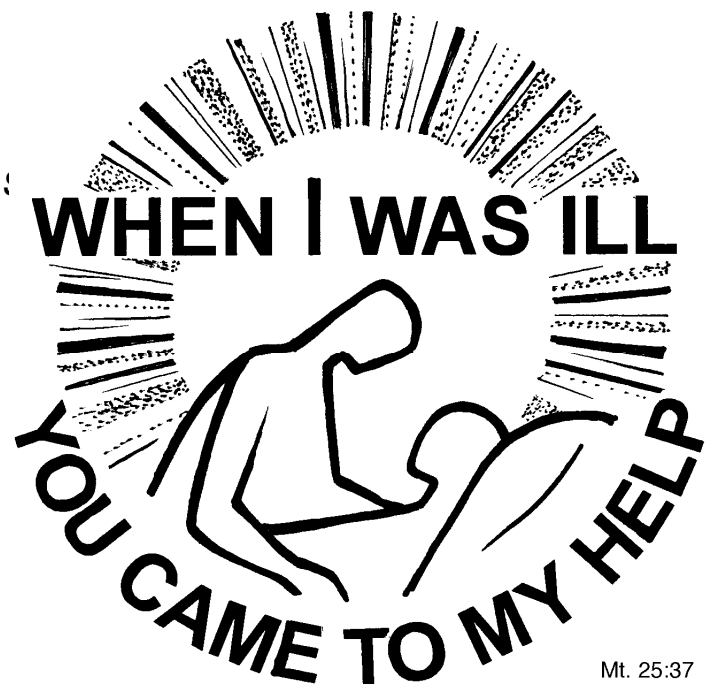

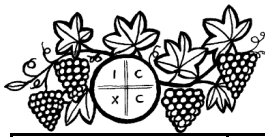

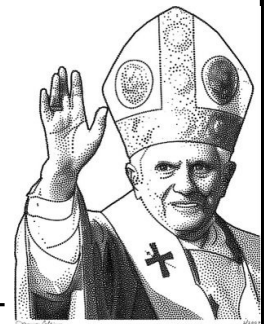

have brought salvation.

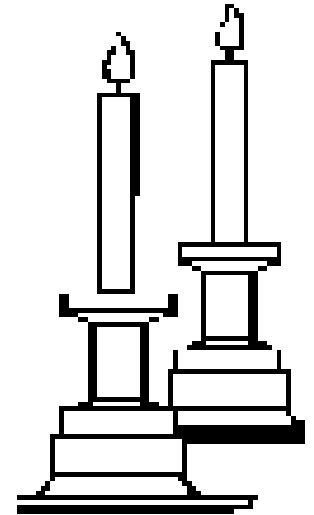
