This work includes new disabled access, new toilets, new kitchen, new heating system and windows.

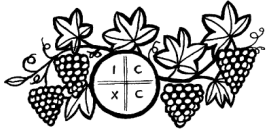
The work is being partly funded by the Parish, plus charitable grants.

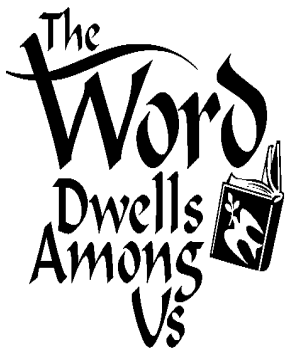

the people he has chosen as his own.

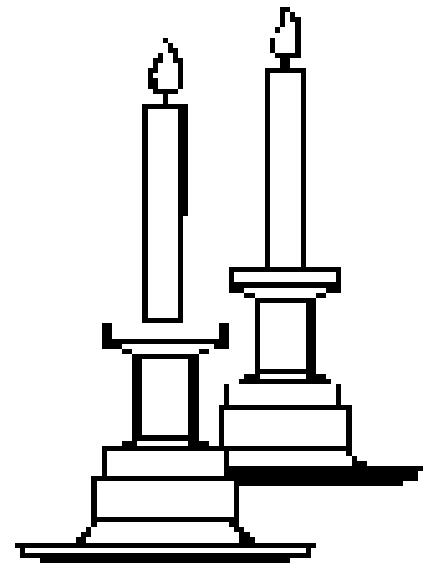
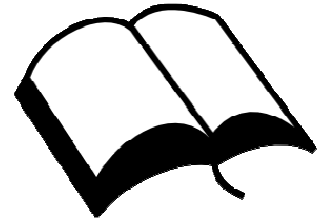
2. The Lord looks on those who revere him,
