

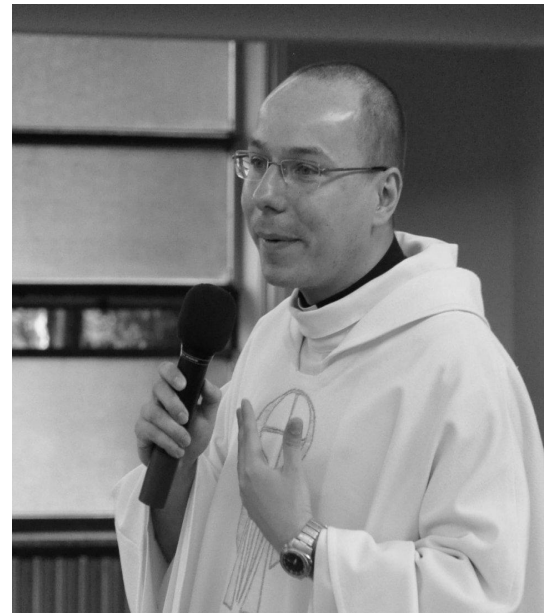

This weekend we welcome Father Tomasz to our Parish. (another "just a simple Polish Priest")

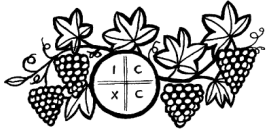

by evening it withers and fades.

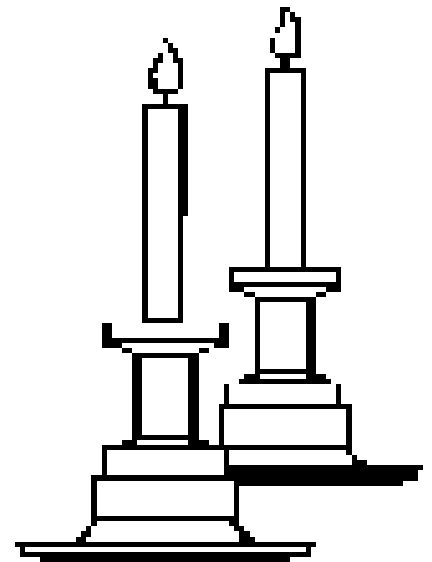
